

## Baltimore's Waterfront Communities

### INNER HARBOR

Originally a 17th century port, the Inner Harbor now offers open-air entertainment, great shops, restaurants and bars, paddleboats, dolphin shows, seasonal celebrations, harbor cruises, and more. Just across President Street is Historic Jonestown, with its numerous landmarks, museums and cultural sites; Little Italy, a cozy neighborhood of ethnic charm and great restaurants; and Harbor East, one of Baltimore's newest waterfront communities.

### HARBOR EAST

This newly developed upscale neighborhood features LEEDS standard buildings and a mix of residential, office, hotel, retail, restaurant and entertainment venues.

### FELLS POINT

Established in 1730 by immigrant William Fell, this popular neighborhood has narrow cobblestone streets lined with cozy pubs, lovingly restored residences, historic inns, unique coffee shops, and funky stores. Widely known as a great place to go for fun, the neighborhood hosts street festivals throughout the year.

### SOUTH BALTIMORE

Surrounding Federal Hill Park, the big hill south of the harbor, South Baltimore is easily recognizable. Many residents have proudly lived here for generations in its restored brick townhomes. The Federal Hill Main Street area includes an eclectic mix of stores, restaurants and taverns along with a city market.

### CANTON

Canton is a dynamic area with deep roots and a bright future. It was in Canton's navy yard that the USS Constellation was built in the 1790's. Tom Thumb, the B&O Railroad's first steam engine, also hails from this neighborhood. Canton is a community of renovated houses, contemporary pubs and restaurants.

## On the Promenade

*Look for these and other interesting sites along the waterfront*

**Canton Waterfront Park** A City park, contains Korean War Memorial and a boat launch.

**Tindeco Can Display** In the lobby of the building, cans produced in the early 1900's.

**Harris Creek Park** A quiet respite on the promenade with a fishing pier.

**Fells Point Visitors Center/Preservation Society** 1724-26 Thames Street, managed by the Preservation Society along with the Robert Long House (oldest house in Baltimore).

**Broadway Pier** This historic dockage pier on the Fells Point Waterfront now features an engraved brick surface and dramatic views of the Harbor.

**Frederick Douglass - Isaac Myers Maritime Park & Museum** managed by the Living Classrooms Foundation, is a national heritage site celebrating the contributions of African Americans in the development of the city's maritime industry.

**Baltimore Maritime Museum** Includes four sites: The US Coast Guard Cutter Taney, the lightship Chesapeake, the submarine Torsk, and the Seven Foot Knoll Lighthouse.

**National Aquarium in Baltimore** Maryland's leading tourist attraction, provides cultural, recreational and educational experiences through exhibits that replicate natural environments.

**USS Constellation** Located on Pier 1, tour this 150 year old historic ship and learn what life was like on board.

**Baltimore Visitor Center** Operated by Convention Bureau, best place to get information about Baltimore sights, see a film and buy tickets.

**West Shore Park & Walter Sondheim Fountain** City Park features 'great lawn' and new interactive fountain children can play in.

**Maryland Science Center** The Inner Harbor's first building, the Science Center engages and entertains young people through interesting, hands on experiences. Includes dinosaur mysteries, a kid's room, IMAX Theatre and changing exhibits.

**Federal Hill Park** Is a wonderful place to view the city, its history and think about the caverns said to be underneath, left over from when sand was mined for a nearby glassworks.
